TEENS CLUB 2023





EVENTS FOR DAAWAH COMMITTEE

Interfaith Program

The interfaith program was a recurrent one before the covid, which, Alhamdulillah, we were able to organize again. The main idea behind the interfaith program is to use Ramadhan as an opportunity to invite non-Muslims to give them an introduction to Islam. Our main goals are to, i) educate non-Muslims about Islam, ii) clear the doubts of non-Muslims about Islam and iii) to promote intercultural tolerance.

The first interfaith was at Razaakh Mohamed which took place on the first weekend of Ramadhan, where approximately 50 non-Muslims came to the event. In this case, we encouraged people in our entourage to invite their non-Muslim friends/colleagues. The event started with the lecture of the Quran and was followed by a talk initiated by Br. Fouad Assotally who gave a brief explanation about Ramadhan and its meaning to Muslims followed by a session of questions and answers. There was then a distribution of iftar and dinner, and the guests were invited to watch us perform the Swalaat. The event then finished with a session of open interaction between which everyone, which turned out to be received quite well by non-Muslims.



The second interfaith program was held on the third week of Ramadhan and was done at the Al Abraar masjid in petit verger. The masjid itself was in charge of inviting non-Muslims from the surrounding neighborhood. The setting was the same as the one at Razaakh Mohamed, where a talk was given by Br Fouad followed by an interactive session and dinner. Despite only 25 non-Muslims came, the event was still considered successful as all guests had better experience than expected.

<u>Ramadan Talks</u>

During this month of Ramadhan, the dawah committee continues to take the initiative to organise talks in masjids. Orators were sent in mosques in locations all around the island where talks were held every week. This is an opportunity for SIM to engage with mussallis as well as maintain a dynamic relationship with masjids all over the island. For this year our main theme was Islamophobia as it is a topic that Muslims have to be aware of and should know how to tackle if ever faced against it. Different speakers talked about different aspect of the same theme as to their ease, this ensured to captivate the attendees but also make sure that they have an in-depth comprehension of the subject.

The WIM also committed to host talks for Muslim women in different masjids for during Ramadhan. The intention is to obviously educate the women of our society but to also use that to bring them together and feel a bond towards society. The attendance in such talks were up to 30 women in some cases.

The different masjids that were involved vary in location from north to south, counting Mahebourg, la Tour Koenig, and Coromandel only to mention a few. The topics touched were ones which would enable us to stay grounded in our Deen, such as the fasting of the tongue, acquiring Taqwa and our goal on this earth. WIM plans to continue these talks in masjids as a way to keep in contact with the masjids but also the women they have already connected to.

Interfaith Program

Every year, Masjid Réduit uses the month of Ramadhan as an opportunity to invite non-Muslim inhabitants of the neighbourhood to an interfaith program. The idea behind the event is to give them an idea of what Islam really is, and to also clear the doubts that they have on one of the most misunderstood religions. This event is also an opportunity to promote tolerance between religions, and is a way to express gratitude towards the Tamil's League for giving us parking space for jummah every week, as well as for zohr during Ramadhan. Interestingly, representatives from the Anglican Church also honored us with their presence.

The event consisted of short talks about different aspects of Islam, which was then followed by a quiz where winners were rewarded with gifts, and by a question answer session, where non-Muslims were invited to clear their doubts. The guests were then invited to have iftar with us and watch us perform the salaat, and the session ended by gifting them dinner in take aways. Alhamdulillah the event was a success with approximately 60 non-Muslims invited from the locality.





Medical Bed

A medical bed was made available to masjid Réduit. We are thus now responsible to maintain, store and manage it, in such a way than it can be lent to someone in need. We pray that Allah rewards the donors, and that Allah grants Jannat-ul-Firdaus to the deceased initial user.





KIDS CLUB

It has been 7 years since SIM has been organizing the Kids Club with annual intakes. As mentioned in previous newsletters, the club continued its activities even during COVID times (online) and this helped to keep in touch with the kids.

For this current year 2023, registration was launched in the beginning of February through SIM NEWS WhatsApp group and the invitation went viral. Alhamdulillah, this created quite an interest in the public at large. Due to limitations in terms of resources such as human, space and logistics SIM Kids Club had no choice than to accommodate a maximum number of 65 kids. We would like to highlight that the Kids Club is also supported by 15+ Helpers. The pool of helpers comprises of some parents, Quranic Arabic students and



interestingly this year, we have onboarded 7 young helpers who were participants of SIM Kids Club but now have joined the teens club.

Insha Allah, twelve sessions are planned for this year and it will include indoor activities, outdoor activities and also outings. We will share more details and some pictures in the next edition of the newsletter.

QUOTE FROM A BOOK*

"The Leadership of Muhammad: A Historical Reconstruction" by Joel Hayward -

"If a student were to ask me whether Muhammad was an effective leader I would reply without hesitation in the affirmative: yes, he was a highly gifted man and an extraordinary leader. If they pressed me further, wanting me to strip away the historical context of Muhammad's Arabia to see whether we might be able to identify from his fascinating life any enduring "lessons" of how a leader might want to consider doing things today, I would write them a list much like the one I offer here:

Character and Qualities

- · Personify and exemplify the best human qualities and values
- · Do not be seen as ambitious or status-conscious
- Never adopt an air of superiority
- · Avoid any self-interest or even the appearance of it
- · Be humble, flexible and open to learning from others
- Continuously self-reflect
- Do not keep doing what does not work
- · Learn quickly from mistakes

Strategic Vision

- Develop a vision for creating a better situation
- · If your vision is bold, be prepared for resistance
- · Persevere and don't surrender that vision
- · Turn that vision into a meaningful set of goals
- · Create the sequence of steps needed to achieve them
- · Resource each of those sufficiently

Strategic Communication

- Explain your vision to everyone who will play a role or be affected
- Explain it frequently using a few carefully chosen key motifs
- Be knowledgeable and assured to establish your credibility
- But also be modest, steady and calm
- Explain clearly why the vision matters and how it will improve things
- · Explain clearly how your people will benefit
- · Explain clearly what you need them to accomplish
- Remember to appeal to both the intellect and emotions

Consensus Building

- Identify any factions or potentially competing interests and needs among you people
- Try to find cooperative solutions that will meet all parties' interests and needs
- Keep watching to ensure as you proceed that everyone can live with the likely outcome
- Ensure that everyone will benefit
- Ensure that everyone knows that they will benefit

Learning from Others

- Consult others often and with an open mind and genuine desire for the critique of your ideas
- Consult people who know what they are talking about and have proven themselves trustworthy
- Do it in a group setting, not just privately with individuals
- · Create an environment in which everyone knows they can approach you with ideas
- If anyone has better ideas or plans than yours do not become defensive
- Try to establish what the majority view is and, if it is likely to move the team forward towards the goals, act upon it
- If it is less likely to do so than your own idea would, have the moral courage to explain why you will not be adopting their view on that occasion
- Give credit and praise to the person whose idea or plan you use

Establishing Rapport

- · Learn about your people's interests, hopes and anxieties
- Search for common ground
- Share in every difficulty that you ask your people to endure
- Work as hard as your most energetic team members
- · Be empathetic
- · Genuinely listen and do not interrupt or talk over anyone

Choosing the Right Way of Dealing with any Opposition

- Rely on persuasion, not power
- Be prepared to compromise or surrender short-term goals if doing so will bring longer-terms benefits or if the opposition at any time becomes too great
- Be prepared to apply reasonable and suitable pressure if anyone cannot be persuaded or will not compromise

Managing People

- · Select the right people by looking for intelligence, passion, energy and reliability
- · Do this even if you do not especially like them
- Never show anyone that you do not like them
- Train them as fully as you can through example
- Trust them to undertake increasingly difficult tasks
- · Tell them what you want, and why, but not how they should do it
- Reward them for accomplishment
- Let a person's success with one responsibility be the basis for receiving a larger responsibility
- Always praise in public
- Overlook imperfections
- Forgive failure if a person has done their best
- Never accept immorality "
